The lord bishoppe of Carlisle, and the rest of the Court
for the middlesex.

The particular misdemeanors of Hutem graynes.

First upon the monday after the death of the late queens most excellent ma^{tie} there was
in the view and sight of the lord bishoppe of Carlisle and others standing on the rampiers
of the castle of Carlisle, discovered a great compaine of persons makinge invasion from
the borders into the inland countie, by the lord bishoppe of Carlisle, suspectinge the same
to tend to the hurt and spoils of the countie, and that the same persons were graynes and
others of their friends, Scots and English, admonished Hutem then present to save his
friends from such evil attempt, whiche Hutem then undertooke to do albeit by might
had done the same.

Secondly that on the tuesday followinge, Hutem graynes brought a 140 persons of his
knights & friends, English and Scotch, upon a towne of his matt, near Carlisle, called
Gargo, and there opened them pituall for the comfort and their horses of horses rest of
the charge of the towne, whiche towne Hutem graynes had for many years before
taken into his possession and had of every husbandman in the towne 4 quartes of malt yearly
for blacke malt, the same quartes beinge of Carlisle measure 20 gallons, makinge a
bushele.

Thirdly he sent all that out of the towne of Gargo, on the wednesday followinge, and the archer
of Eden into grinstab and then followed him self where he and his compaignie at men
of warre carried two pensells of linnen cloth on the topp of lances, and the same day
fourthly that wednesday he had his compaignie beinge armed wth Jacobes speares, pistolls,
and shott weapons all on horse assaulted, Captaine Bonyer or his lieutenant and
his subdit, and had driven them to the worst if he had not assisted a compaignie of
the townsmen of Carlisle cominge from the towne to the rescue of his matt subdit.

Fifthly that Hutem & his compaignie after the cominge of the Carlisle men left the
pursuit of the English subdit and the compaignie, and went up into the countie
westward to spoils the same, and first they spoiled a place called Bor, robbinge men
in the way spoiled their horses, & from thence they went forward towards a village
called orten, where they spoiled the towne, burnt Johnsons his house, took all his goods,
robbed divers persons, and took of spoils.
