names are here underwritten, that it will please your highnes to vouchsafe to
accept your most humble acknowledg^{mt} of their faulte and transgressions past.
So it is most hartely desired that your said good subjects, and many other of
your children kindred and blood freinds, Conaule & servants inhabiting wth in
the bounde of Este and Leorn, beinge the border of the realme of England against
Gottland, men brought upp in ignorance, and not havinge had means to learn their
due obedience to god and your most excellent matie, of late and immediatly after the
deathe of the Quene's most excellent ma^{tie}, your matie have dearely & disorderly
